

Reunion is only months away!

Reunion registration packages and fees

You have five Reunion packages from which to choose.

- **Thursday through Sunday** covers events from Thursday dinner through Sunday breakfast. \$315 early-bird special; \$340 starting May 2.
- **Friday before Dinner through Sunday** covers events from Friday dinner through Sunday breakfast. \$260 early bird special; \$285 starting May 2.
- **Friday after dinner through Sunday** (arrival after 8 p.m. Friday) covers events from Friday night ice cream social through Sunday breakfast. \$235 early-bird special; \$260 starting May 2.
- **Saturday and Sunday** covers events from Saturday lunch through Sunday breakfast and includes a souvenir. \$210 early-bird special; \$235 starting May 2.
- **Saturday** covers Saturday lunch through Saturday dinner. *Does not include a souvenir or button.* \$150 early-bird special; \$175 starting May 2.

To qualify for the early-bird rate, registration must be submitted online or postmarked by midnight EDT on May 1.

These packages include all class and most university events, including the following:

Class receptions and meals, souvenirs, clerk wages, class vans, tent, headquarters food and beverages, entertainment, and much, much more. Additionally, the packages include your class Reunion 2009 button. Unless otherwise noted, this button must be worn at all times to gain access to the shuttle buses, university events, and class events.

Your registration fee does not cover the following:

Housing, items marked “optional” on the registration form, some athletic events, and certain ticketed university events. See the highlights and athletics brochures enclosed in your packet for details.

We encourage you to register securely online at classof64.alumni.cornell.edu. It makes the process easier and faster for you and for our registration chair. If you register by mail you will receive a confirmation within two weeks of registering containing all of your registration choices and other class-specific details.

Campus headquarters and housing

Class headquarters and housing will be located on West Campus in Keeton House. Overflow rooms are located in the newest West Campus house, Flora Rose House, right next door.

Housing fees are separate from the class packages and are set by the university. The cost is \$49 per adult per night or \$118.50 per adult for the entire weekend (a savings of \$28.50!). Rooms are equipped with bed linens, bath towels, washcloths, and clothes hangers (radios, irons, hair dryers, and clocks are NOT provided). A daily towel exchange will be provided, but there is no maid service. Pets (other than guide dogs) are not permitted. Smoking is not permitted in Cornell dormitories or other buildings. Check-in begins at noon on Thursday, and check-out is on Sunday by noon.

Cornell Information Technologies offers, at no charge, the use of broadband Internet service in the dorm rooms. Before you arrive on campus, please make sure your computer is current with the latest system and antivirus definition updates. Limited wireless guest access may also be available in some areas on campus.

There are a limited number of doubles in Keeton House. They will be pre-assigned to classmates staying two or more nights on a first-to-register basis. We encourage all of our classmates with special needs to attend Reunion. If you have a special housing need (near an elevator, handicapped accessible bathroom, etc.), please be sure to note it on the registration form and return it no later than May 22. If you prefer not to register with our class, you will not be permitted to stay at our class headquarters. However, other on-campus housing is available. For details about non-Reunion-year housing, go to the Reunion website at alumni.cornell.edu/reunion/non-reunion-year.cfm. Pre-registration is not necessary for non-Reunion-year housing.

Hotels

Hotel rooms in Ithaca are limited during Reunion. If you prefer to stay in a hotel, our class has a small block of rooms in the following hotels: Hilton Garden Inn (607-277-8900), Courtyard by Marriott (866-541-3600), and La Tourelle (607-273-2734). Please call the hotel now to make a reservation and tell them that you are with the Cornell Class of '64. Rooms will be released May 4. If you need to put your name on a hotel waiting list, we recommend that you register for a dorm room in the interim.



Getting to Ithaca

If you are looking for a ride to and from Ithaca, or have room in your vehicle and can drive others, there is an Alumni Ride Sharing board at alumni.cornell.edu/rideboard.

Transportation between Ithaca and New York City is available through Campus-to-Campus coach service. For more information, go to the transportation section on the university Reunion website or call the Office of Alumni Affairs.

Parking and transportation

Parking on West Campus lawns is prohibited, except on Libe Slope. Your cooperation and support are essential to maintaining the renowned beauty of our campus landscape. Please see your registration confirmation for details on where to drop off luggage at our headquarters.

Buses have been scheduled to transport our class to major class events, and class vans will be available for our exclusive use. In addition, three Reunion shuttle buses will be running continuously from 7 a.m. to 1 a.m. throughout the weekend. A van equipped to carry a wheelchair will also be available upon request. A map of the campus and surrounding area can be found on the university Reunion website.

Consistent with the university's commitment to diversity and inclusiveness, our goal is to provide an accessible and welcoming environment for all alumni and guests. Reunion attendees with mobility impairments, who may have difficulty getting around campus, should contact the Office of Alumni Affairs (607-255-7085) to make arrangements in advance for building accessibility, parking, and transportation assistance throughout the weekend.

What to wear

Dress casually for the weekend. Remember, Ithaca weather can be unpredictable; mornings and evenings can be chilly, and there can be rain, so come prepared!
