Professor Einaudi to Direct International Studies Center

The Center is one result of the work of the Centennial Planning Committee, which has been broadly planning the University's course of growth during its second century.

Present study programs dealing with China, Southeast Asia, South Asia and Latin America; agricultural programs in the Philippines; and foreign teaching and research commitments of the University faculty and students will be supported by the Center.

Since it is believed that increased participation in international affairs will become ever more essential, the Center will seek new funds for more research fellowships at both the student and post-doctoral levels. In addition, it will attempt to link the University with other groups active in the international area, including domestic and foreign universities and government and private agencies, and will assist foreign students enrolled at the University.

Prof. Einaudi will be aided by two associate directors, Prof. John W. Mellor of the College of Agriculture and Prof. Steven Muller of the Department of Government. An executive committee composed of University faculty members will assist them.
