### Shields Calls Spring Rites 'Successful'

"We had two tremendously successful events, and the attendance was the best in three or four years," commented Albert M. Shields '63, chairman of the Spring Weekend Sommittee, and University Proctor Lowell T. George remarked that conduct was "pretty good," as the "Rites of Spring" officially closed last night.

The weekend began Friday night with the crowning of Leslie A. Doran '65 as Spring Weekend Queen at a Barton Hall Dance serenaded by Chubby Checker, rock-n-roll king, and it continued through Sunday with fraternity parties as well as organized campus events such as the Barton Hall Concert Saturday night.

Mishaps over the Weekend included an automobile accident involving five University students. It occurred when two cars collided near Stewart Avenue and Campus Road at approximately 6 p.m. yesterday.

One of the drivers, Kenyon S. Laven '63, suffered a punctured left arm and was admitted to the University infirmary, although his condition was reported as good. Laven will be charged with driving at improper speed and driving on the wrong side of the road.
